"Musician" is, in fact, a fascinating introduction into the basics of music, with a special keyboard overlay which actually transforms the computer keyboard into a piano keyboard. With it you can learn to play and read music and compose simple tunes which the computer will then play back to you. You can even use your G7000 as part of a 'Group', by programming-in rhythms and melodies which can be played back at varying pitches and tempos. "Musician" can be played by one or two people simultaneously. It's probably the most 'fun' method of learning yet invented!

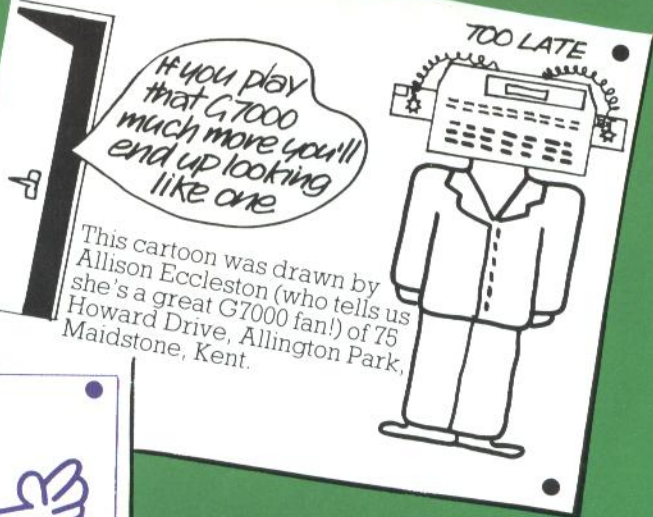
CLUB PIN BOARD
