can track your turret so are tough to knock out. If you get one, score 4.

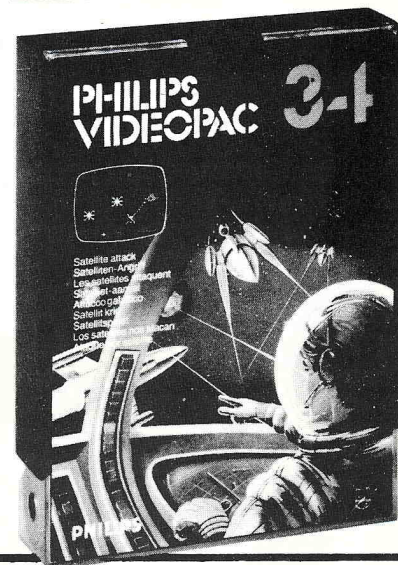

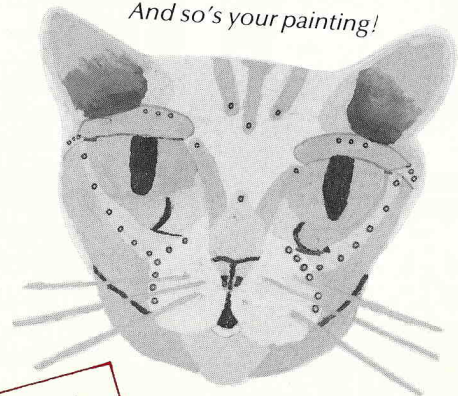
